NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

Pursuant to the provisions of Rhode Island Gen. Laws §39-3-11, as amended, the Public Utilities Commission (PUC) will conduct a hearing on **Tuesday, October 11, 2022** @ 9:30 A.M. at the PUC's office, Hearing Room A, 89 Jefferson Boulevard, Warwick, Rhode Island. The hearing will be streamed live at https://video.ibm.com/channel/WqQyXw296dg. At this hearing, the PUC will examine the propriety of filings submitted by Rhode Island Energy to implement rate change to the Company's Distribution Adjustment Charge (DAC) and Gas Cost Recovery Charge. Rhode Island Energy proposes the rate change to take effect November 1, 2022.

In Docket No. 22-13-NG, Rhode Island Energy filed to amend the DAC factors. The DAC is designed to provide for the recovery and reconciliation of the costs of identifiable special programs. The DAC includes an annual System Pressure factor; an Environmental Response Cost factor; a Pension Adjustment Factor; an Arrearage Management Adjustment Factor; a Revenue Decoupling Adjustment factor; rate class specific Infrastructure, Safety, and Reliability factors; a Service Quality Performance factor; two Reconciliation factors for last year's DAC factors; an Earnings Sharing Mechanism factor; a Low Income Discount Recovery Factor and a Storm Net Revenue factor. For the average Residential Heating customer using 845 therms annually, this represents an annual bill increase of \$151.25 as compared to the DAC rates currently in effect.

In Docket No. 22-20-NG, Rhode Island Energy filed to ament the GCR factors. The GCR filing provides the customer class-specific factors necessary for the Company to recover projected gas costs allocated to firm sales customers for the period November 1, 2021 through October 31, 2022. For the average Residential Heating customer using 845 therms annually, this represents an annual bill increase of \$75.98 as compared to the GCR rate currently in effect.

The combined bill impact on an average residential heating customer using 845 therms annually represents an increase of \$227.23 or 15% from \$1,514.68 to \$1,741.91. The impact on other customer rate classes will vary depending upon the rate class and usage.

The filings may be examined at the PUC's office. The filings can also be accessed at <u>http://www.ripuc.ri.gov</u>, under Docket No. 22-13-NG and Docket No. 22-20-NG. Reference is made to Chapters 39-1, 39-3 and 42-35 of the Rhode Island General Laws.
