REPORT AND ORDER

Pursuant to R.I. Gen. Laws § 39-1-27.12,¹ on September 1, 2021, the Department of Human Services (DHS) filed with the Public Utilities Commission (PUC) its recommended Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) Enhancement Charge for calendar year 2022 (2022 Charge), proposing a charge of \$0.81 per month for each customer.² The Narragansett Electric Company d/b/a National Grid³ (National Grid) reported the LIHEAP Enhancement Fund balance was \$2,597,939 as of August 31, 2021.⁴ The LIHEAP Enhancement plan requires the 2022 Charge to produce revenues between \$6.5 million and \$7.5 million from electric and gas customers, combined.

In response to a data request, National Grid calculated that the recommended 2022 Charge, if made effective January 1, 2022, would generate approximately \$7.6 million in total revenues from electric and gas customers.⁵ National Grid indicated that a charge of \$0.79 would result in

approximately \$7.5 million in total revenues.⁶ As a result of this calculation, the Division of Public Utilities and Carriers (Division) recommended the 2022 Charge be set at \$0.79 per month.⁷

At an Open Meeting held on November 29, 2021, the PUC reviewed the filings in this docket and approved a rate of \$0.79 per month for each customer for calendar year 2022. While the PUC typically follows DHS's recommendation, in this case, that recommended charge would have resulted in collections that exceeded the statutory maximum. Therefore, the PUC followed the Division's recommendation to keep the collections within the statutory bandwidth. The PUC also approved National Grid's tariff changes, finding them to be consistent with the 2016 statutory changes.

Accordingly, it is hereby (24579) ORDERED:

- 1. The LIHEAP Enhancement Charge shall be \$0.79 per month for each customer for the calendar year 2022, with the term 'customer' defined as any person taking service from an electric or gas distribution company at a single point of electricity or gas delivery or electric or gas meter, is hereby approved on bills issued on and after January 1, 2022.
- 2. The Narragansett Electric Company d/b/a National Grid shall include an explanatory statement on customers' bills regarding the LIHEAP Enhancement Charge.
- 3. The Narragansett Electric Company d/b/a National Grid shall file with the Public Utilities Commission, with a copy to the parties to this docket, semi-annual reconciliations no later than May 31, 2022 and September 30, 2022.
