Record Request No. 1

Request:

Please provide the Company's understanding of a situation where there is solar on a customer's premise, whether the Company understands there is a communication type device on the premise to communicate with the developer. If a customer already has a communicating meter on its house, such as for distributed generation and/or solar meters, what is the Company's understanding of the difference between that type of meter and an AMF meter? Please include the Company's general understanding in the industry of the configuration of these types of non-Company owned meters.

Response:

It is the Company's understanding that a typical residential solar installation package is a communications type device that includes measurement/monitoring capabilities with a means of transmitting data to the customer and/or manufacturer via a communication path such as Wi-Fi, cellular, etc.

AMF meters can communicate with a customer's home area network via Wi-Fi in support of future applications and functionality. This feature will be utilized at the discretion of the customer if they choose to sign up once the functionality is available. The Wi-Fi communications associated with the AMF meter are generally of a similar type to the Wi-Fi communications used in the typical solar installation package. Separately, to communicate with the Company, AMF meters utilize radio frequency ("RF") communications to send and receive data and messages to and from the RF Network. These RF communications are generally of a similar type to the cellular communications used in the typical solar installation package.

The Company understands that there could also be many differences between a residential solar system's measurement/monitoring capability and an AMF meter, such as, but not limited to, the following: physical specifications, i.e., form factor, what is being measured and from where (electrically), the type of communication path, and where the data goes, i.e., to the customer and/or manufacturer vs. to the Company.
