Notes

- All electricity generated within the ISO New England (ISO-NE) control area and fed on to the New England grid, as well as electricity exchanged between ISO-NE and adjacent control areas, is tracked via the New England Power Pool (NEPOOL) Generation Information System (GIS). For each megawatt hour (MWh) of electricity generated within or exchanged between the ISO-NE control area, whether renewable or not, one serial-numbered, electronic GIS certificate is created. The GIS certificate represents all attributes of characteristics, such as fuel source, air emissions, location, etc. of that one MWh of electricity. The information in this Energy Source Disclosure is based on GIS Certificates obtained and retired by the Supplier.
- Renewable Energy Standard (RES): is defined in the R.I. Gen Laws 39-26. The GIS certificates are retired by June 15th of the following year. This is calculated by multiplying the retired certificates for each power source by the renewable energy standard percentage of the product.
- Voluntary: GIS certificates of REC attributes in addition to the RES. The Voluntary REC attributes will be entirely from sources qualified as RI New sources (See R.I. Gen Laws 39-26) that are located only in New England. The GIS certificates can be retired by September 15th of the following year. This is calculated by multiplying the retired certificates for each power source by the voluntary RI New percentage of the product.
- Other Known Resources: Any other GIS certificates for electricity obtained by Supplier from specific generating units.
- Residual Mix: NextEra Energy Services Rhode Island may purchase electricity supply from system power contracts, not from specific generating units. System power is assigned attributes based on the mix of GIS certificates of sources found on the New England electricity grid that have not been obtained and retired by other entities, referred to as the "Residual Mix". The Residual Mix will largely be non-renewable, because most GIS certificates for renewable energy are obtained to meet the RI RES (and their equivalent in other New England states) or voluntary requirements. The total Residual Mix is reduced by the REC attributes retired based on the product chosen.
- Emissions for the product are calculated based on the emissions for the GIS Certificates the Supplier has obtained and retired. Average emissions for all power sources are calculated based on the System Mix from NEPOOL GIS, which include all GIS Certificates in the entire system. 100% is the average (baseline) emissions of the System Mix.

The City of Providence is pleased to introduce you to Providence Community Electricity Program, our city’s electricity supply program. The Program aims to help our community members manage electricity costs, increase renewable energy use, and reduce carbon pollution. Providence City Council approved this program in July 2020.

You received this letter because your electricity account is scheduled for automatic enrollment in the city’s program starting September 2024. The deadline to take action before enrollment is August 15, 2024. Your participation in Providence's program is voluntary. This letter explains your options.

YOUR OPTIONS

- 1 Automatically enroll in Providence Standard** - To enroll in Providence Standard, no action is needed.
- 2 Choose to enroll in another Providence product** - To choose another Providence product, call our Program’s electricity supplier, NextEra Energy Services Rhode Island, LLC, at (888) 387-1084, or submit a request at Electricity.ProvidenceRI.gov.
- 3 Choose to continue with Rhode Island Energy’s supply, called Last Resort Service** - To remain with Last Resort Service for your electricity supply, you must opt out. To opt out before being automatically enrolled, you must take one of the following actions on or before **August 15, 2024**:
 Postmark and mail the enclosed opt-out card *or* call Providence's supplier, NextEra Energy Services Rhode Island, LLC at (888) 387-1084 *or* submit the opt-out form at Electricity.ProvidenceRI.gov

The Last Resort Service Rate above reflects the total rate as filed by Rhode Island Energy in dockets PUC 24-04-EL, 24-07-EL, 24-08-EL and 24-15-EL. The proposed Last Resort Service Industrial rate has not yet been approved by the PUC as of June 20, 2024 and includes components that may be adjusted by Rhode Island Energy. The Program cannot guarantee savings beyond the current term of Last Resort Service, as stated in the table above, because future Last Resort Service rates are unknown.

ELECTRICITY SUPPLY PRODUCT DETAIL

- Program prices apply to service beginning and ending on the days of the month that your meter is read.
- Program prices include a fee of \$0.001 per kilowatt-hour (kWh) for the City’s aggregation consultant. Any applicable taxes will be added by Rhode Island Energy to your bill.
- At the end of the pricing term, you will be automatically renewed in your current product which may have a new price and a different percentage of voluntary renewable energy as negotiated by the City. Pricing is expected to change every six to twelve months for Commercial customers and every three months for Industrial customers. The City will announce price changes at least 30 days before any such price change takes effect. Product details will always be available at the City’s website for the Program: Electricity.ProvidenceRI.gov.
- You may leave the Program at any time by contacting Providence's Supplier at (888) 387-1084 or by visiting the Program website at Electricity.ProvidenceRI.gov.
- Rhode Island requires all electricity supply products to include a minimum amount of renewable energy, known as the Renewable Energy Standard (RES). Some Providence Program products contain voluntary renewable energy that exceeds the RES, as shown below:

Generation sources that qualify for the RES are known as RI New and must be built after 1997 and be located within, or delivered to, New England (2% may come from sources built prior to 1997, called RI Existing). The Providence Program sources all voluntary renewable energy, above the RES, from sources that qualify as RI New, come from solar, wind, anaerobic digestion, and low-impact hydro, and are located only within New England.

PROVIDENCE PROGRAM DETAIL

- Providence Program website: Electricity.ProvidenceRI.gov. The Program is served by NextEra Energy Services Rhode Island, LLC, PUC license number: D-96-6(M3), (888) 387-1084.
- There are two parts to your Rhode Island Energy electricity bill, (1) Delivery Services and (2) Supply Services. If you participate in Providence's Program:
 - Rhode Island Energy will continue to provide all Delivery Services, including responding to power outages. You will continue to receive your electricity bill from Rhode Island Energy.
 - The Supply Services portion of the Rhode Island Energy bill will change to reflect your participation in Providence's program.
 - Budget billing customers will continue to receive budget billing for the Delivery Services portion of the bill.
 - Customers that receive solar electricity benefits from net metering credits and/or Renewable Energy Growth Program payments will continue to receive those benefits.
 - You may leave the Program or switch to a different program option at any time, without penalty.
- If you have questions about the Delivery Services portion of your bill or about Last Resort Service supply, contact Rhode Island Energy at (855) 743-1101, or visit RIEnergy.com.
- If you are receiving electricity supply from a competitive supplier and believe you have received this opt-out letter in error, you must notify Providence's supplier as outlined in the third option above. This will ensure you continue to receive your electricity from that competitive supplier and prevent any possible early termination fees.

City of Providence Announces Winter Rates for Providence Community Electricity Program

Tuesday, October 8

Today, the City of Providence announced the new winter supply rate for the Providence Community Electricity Program, effective with the November 2024 meter read. The winter rate for the Providence Standard supply option will be set at 16.287 cents/kWh for a period of six months, providing a cost-competitive alternative to Rhode Island Energy's supply rate of 16.387 cents/kWh. Current participants do not need to take any action to remain in the program and receive the new pricing for the product in which they are currently enrolled.

"Since taking office, I have prioritized building partnerships and supporting initiatives that create a more sustainable, resilient city," said Mayor Brett P. Smiley. "By integrating renewable energy into the default electricity option, the Providence Community Electricity Program remains the easiest way for our community to reduce their carbon footprint, save money on their electricity bills and join our collective efforts to build a healthier future for generations to come."

The Providence Community Electricity Program, [launched last year](#), was designed to help residents and local businesses manage electricity costs, increase renewable energy use and reduce carbon pollution. The Providence Standard program offers 5% more renewable energy than Rhode Island Energy's Last Resort Service, while also saving participants more than \$1.4 million from May 2023 through August 2024. In collaboration with Providence-based nonprofit Green Energy Consumers Alliance, the Providence Community Electricity Program ensures that clean energy is sourced locally from wind turbines in Providence and Coventry, as well as solar energy from West Greenwich. Additionally, the program purchases over 15,500 megawatt hours of voluntary renewable energy each year, helping to reduce more than 11 million pounds of carbon dioxide emissions.

City of Providence Announces Summer Rates for Providence Community Electricity Program

City's default electricity option prices drop from 16.287 cents/kWh to 10.014 cents/kWh

Today, the City of Providence announced the new summer electricity supply rate for the Providence Community Electricity Program, effective with the May 2025 meter read. Prices will be substantially decreasing, from **16.287 cents/kWh** this past winter down to **10.014 cents/kWh** for the City's default electricity option. The new prices will be fixed for six months through customers' November 2025 meter read. Current participants do not need to take any action to remain in the program and receive the new pricing for the product in which they are currently enrolled.

"We know that utility rates have been rising, and I'm pleased that we are able to provide a more affordable and sustainable option for our community," said Mayor Brett P. Smiley. "Since taking office, I have prioritized building strong partnerships and supporting initiatives that create a more sustainable and resilient city. Through the Providence Community Electricity program, we are making it easier than ever for our community to reduce their carbon footprint, lower their electricity bills and support a greener, more resilient future for Providence."

The Providence Community Electricity Program, launched in 2023, was designed to help residents and local businesses manage electricity costs, increase renewable energy use and reduce carbon pollution. This May, Providence Community Electricity will have served the community for two years. The City is pleased to have delivered on the program's goals of offering residents and businesses cleaner electricity, at affordable prices. Through the end of 2024, PCE has delivered \$3.2 million in savings, with \$2.4 million in savings coming from residential participation.

Most participants in Providence's program use "Providence Standard," which offers 5% more renewable energy than Rhode Island Energy's Last Resort Service. The additional renewable energy is sourced entirely from local Rhode Island projects, including the Narragansett Bay Commission wind turbines at Fields Point in Providence, solar in West Greenwich and additional wind turbines in Coventry. Residents and businesses may also choose to increase the renewable energy content of their electricity supply to 50% or 100% renewable at any time. Enrollees are allowed to opt-out of the program at any time with no cost.

The voluntary renewable energy content in the program's standard and optional products comes from projects that qualify as RI New and makes a sizable impact on the City's carbon footprint. Providence participants annually purchase more than 20,000 megawatt-hours of voluntary renewable energy, equivalent to displacing over 14 million pounds of carbon dioxide emissions.
