Notes

- All electricity generated within the ISO New England (ISO-NE) control area and fed on to the New England grid, as well as electricity exchanged between ISO-NE and adjacent control areas, is tracked via the New England Power Pool (NEPOOL) Generation Information System (GIS). For each megawatt hour (MWh) of electricity generated within or exchanged between the ISO-NE control area, whether renewable or not, one serial-numbered, electronic GIS certificate is created. The GIS certificate represents all attributes of characteristics, such as fuel source, air emissions, location, etc. of that one MWh of electricity. The information in this Energy Source Disclosure is based on GIS Certificates obtained and retired by the Supplier.
- Renewable Energy Standard (RES): is defined in the R.I. Gen Laws 39-26. The GIS certificates are retired by June 15th of the following year. This is calculated by multiplying the retired certificates for each power source by the renewable energy standard percentage of the product.
- Voluntary: GIS certificates of REC attributes in addition to the RES. The Voluntary REC attributes will be entirely from sources qualified as RI New sources (See R.I. Gen Laws 39-26) that are located only in New England. The GIS certificates can be retired by September 15th of the following year. This is calculated by multiplying the retired certificates for each power source by the voluntary RI New percentage of the product.
- Other Known Resources: Any other GIS certificates for electricity obtained by Supplier from specific generating units.
- Residual Mix: NextEra Energy Services Rhode Island may purchase electricity supply from system power contracts, not from specific generating units. System power is assigned attributes based on the mix of GIS certificates of sources found on the New England electricity grid that have not been obtained and retired by other entities, referred to as the "Residual Mix". The Residual Mix will largely be non-renewable, because most GIS certificates for renewable energy are obtained to meet the RI RES (and their equivalent in other New England states) or voluntary requirements. The total Residual Mix is reduced by the REC attributes retired based on the product chosen.
- Emissions for the product are calculated based on the emissions for the GIS Certificates the Supplier has obtained and retired. Average emissions for all power sources are calculated based on the System Mix from NEPOOL GIS, which include all GIS Certificates in the entire system. 100% is the average (baseline) emissions of the System Mix.

The Town of Portsmouth is pleased to introduce you to the Portsmouth Community Electricity Program, our Town's electricity supply program. The Program aims to help our community members manage electricity costs, increase renewable energy use, and reduce carbon pollution. Portsmouth Town Council approved this program in August 2020.

You received this letter because your electricity account is scheduled for automatic enrollment in the town's program starting September 2024. The deadline to take action before enrollment is August 15, 2024. Your participation in Portsmouth's program is voluntary. This letter explains your options.

YOUR OPTIONS

- 1 **Automatically enroll in Portsmouth Standard** - To enroll in Portsmouth Standard, no action is needed.
- 2 **Choose to enroll in another Portsmouth product** - To choose another Portsmouth product, call our program's electricity supplier, NextEra Energy Services Rhode Island, LLC, at (888) 387-1083, or submit a request at Electricity.PortsmouthRI.com.
- 3 **Choose to continue with Rhode Island Energy's supply, called Last Resort Service** - To remain with Last Resort Service for your electricity supply, you must opt out. To opt out before being automatically enrolled you must take one of the following actions on or before **August 15, 2024**:

The Last Resort Service Rate above reflects the total rate as filed by Rhode Island Energy in dockets PUC 24-04-EL, 24-07-EL, 24-08-EL and 24-15-EL. The proposed Last Resort Service Industrial rate has not yet been approved by the PUC as of June 20, 2024 and includes components that may be adjusted by Rhode Island Energy. The Program cannot guarantee savings beyond the current term of Last Resort Service, as stated in the table above, because future Last Resort Service rates are unknown.

ELECTRICITY SUPPLY PRODUCT DETAIL

- Program prices apply to service beginning and ending on the days of the month that your meter is read.
- Program prices include a fee of \$0.001 per kilowatt-hour (kWh) for the town’s aggregation consultant. Any applicable taxes will be added to your bill by Rhode Island Energy.
- At the end of the pricing term, you will be automatically renewed in your current product which may have a new price and a different percentage of voluntary renewable energy as negotiated by the Town. Pricing is expected to change every six to twelve months for Commercial customers and every three months for Industrial customers. The Town will announce price changes at least 30 days before any such price change takes effect. Product details will always be available at the town’s website for the Program: Electricity.PortsmouthRI.com.
- You may leave the Program at any time by contacting Portsmouth's Supplier at (888) 387-1083, or by visiting the program website at Electricity.PortsmouthRI.com.
- Rhode Island requires all electricity supply products to include a minimum amount of renewable energy, known as the Renewable Energy Standard (RES). Some Portsmouth program products contain voluntary renewable energy that exceeds the RES, as shown below:

Generation sources that qualify for the RES are known as RI New and must be built after 1997 and be located within, or delivered to, New England (2% may come from sources built prior to 1997, called RI Existing). The Portsmouth Program sources all voluntary renewable energy, above the RES, from sources that qualify as RI New, come from solar, wind, anaerobic digestion, and low-impact hydro, and are located only within New England.

PORTSMOUTH PROGRAM DETAIL

- There are two parts to your Rhode Island Energy electricity bill, (1) Delivery Services and (2) Supply Services. If you participate in Portsmouth's program:
 - Rhode Island Energy will continue to provide all Delivery Services, including responding to power outages. You will continue to receive your electricity bill from Rhode Island Energy.
 - The Supply Services portion of the bill will change to reflect your participation in Portsmouth's program.
 - Budget billing customers will continue to receive budget billing for the Delivery Services portion of the bill.

The Last Resort Service Rate above reflects the total rate as filed by Rhode Island Energy in dockets PUC 25-03-EL and the rate has not yet been approved by the PUC as of March 17, 2025. The Portsmouth Community Electricity Program cannot guarantee savings compared to Rhode Island Energy Last Resort Service for the duration of the Program pricing because future Last Resort Service prices are unknown.

Portsmouth is part of a group of seven municipalities who shared in launching the first municipal aggregation programs in Rhode Island. Barrington, Central Falls, Narragansett, Newport, Portsmouth, Providence, and South Kingstown are all working with Good Energy as their consultant and share a common electricity supplier and pricing.

The voluntary renewable energy content in the program's standard and optional products comes from projects that qualify as RI New and makes a sizable impact on the Town's carbon footprint. Portsmouth participants annually purchase more than 2,800 megawatt-hours of voluntary renewable energy, equivalent to displacing over 2,000,000 pounds of carbon dioxide emissions.
