Dear RI EFSB,

I am writing with a comment in support of SouthCoast Wind Energy LLC's Application for a License to Construct Major Energy Facilities, Portsmouth RI, Docket No. SB-2022-02. This project is crucial to meeting Rhode Island's clean energy goals, strengthening our grid, and delivering good jobs and economic growth to Portsmouth and our state.

In September 2024, Rhode Island and Massachusetts competitively selected SouthCoast Wind as the best-value option for our energy future, and with good reason. This project will provide enough clean, reliable wind energy to power more than 800,000 homes across New England, including more than 125,000 homes here in Rhode Island. It will prevent winter power outages and price spikes, which are so disruptive to vulnerable family budgets. From a global perspective, it will, even more importantly, move us away from expensive, polluting fossil fuel plants, and fight the deadly effects of climate change that are already on the rise in our state.
