Request:

Response:

To put this question in context, when a customer authorizes their data to be shared via Green Button Connect, all electric accounts with AMF meters that are associated with that customer will be shared with the authorized third-party vendor.

If one or more of a customer's accounts is closed, the data relating to the closed account(s) would stop being shared with the authorized third-party vendor, but the data relating to any remaining accounts would continue to be shared. If an account is added under a customer, the data for this new premises automatically would be shared with the already authorized third party. This includes the scenario where a customer only has one account and closes this account. If they add a new account under the same customer credentials, this data would automatically be shared with the already authorized third party.

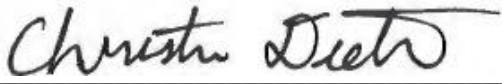
