Re: Docket No. 26-01-DG - **Revity Energy LLC and Affiliates Petition for Relief Directing Compliance with the Interconnection Tariff and Interconnection Service Agreements (Dispute Resolution)**

On January 6, 2026, Revity Energy LLC (Revity) filed a Petition for Relief with the Public Utilities Commission (Commission) alleging that Rhode Island Energy (RIE) had violated the Standards for Connecting Distributed Generation (RIPUC No. 2258). Revity asserted that RIE had missed the tariff deadlines for (1) providing final reconciliation payments for three projects and (2) issuing an interconnection design for another.

While Revity filed this as a Petition for Relief, the filing fell within the Dispute Resolution section of RIPUC No. 2258.¹ Therefore, RIE was advised to file its response per the deadlines sent forth in RIPUC No. 2258.

On January 21, 2026, RIE filed its Response in accordance with Section 9.2 of RIPUC No. 2258. RIE advised that on January 16, 2026, operations personnel from the Company and the Petitioners had a meeting during which significant progress was made with respect to the Petitioner's prayer for relief. The Company (1) committed to issuing Central Pike its final reconciliation payment by January 30, 2026 pending comments on the Final Accounting Report from Central Pike; (2) had issued Central South an interconnection design on January 6, 2026; and (3) had processed final reconciliation payments for Case Nos. 518476 and 538025 on January 20, 2026 for Jenckes Hill Solar.

On January 29, 2026, I conducted a Section 9.2(b) meeting with the parties. At the meeting, the parties agreed that RIE's commitments would resolve the dispute. The parties agreed to keep the matter open until March 2, 2026, at which time, unless there was an issue with the resolutions that had been achieved, I would close out the matter.

On March 3, 2026, I contacted the parties to confirm that the matter could be closed as resolved. Revity provided email confirmation. Thus, no further Commission action is required.

¹ Section 9 of RIPUC No. 2258 includes a requirement that the complainant attempt resolution through an escalation to an RIE vice president prior to filing with the Commission. It was unclear whether that had happened in this case. However, RIE consented to following the post-petition process in this matter.
