NOTICE OF OPEN MEETING

Pursuant to the provisions of the Rhode Island Open Meetings Act, R.I.G.L. 42-46-6 (b), the public is hereby notified that the Public Utilities Commission (Commission or PUC) is holding an open meeting on **Friday, June 5, 2026 @ 10:00 A.M.** in Hearing Room A, 89 Jefferson Boulevard, Warwick, Rhode Island for purpose of discussing, deliberating and/or voting on the following dockets. Because this is not a hearing, the PUC will not be accepting oral public comments. The Open Meeting will be streamed live at <https://video.ibm.com/channel/WqQyXw296dg>.

- I. Call to Order
- II. **Docket No. 4373 – Interstate Navigation Company (Interstate)** – Interstate Navigation’s passenger and vehicle tickets include a fuel credit of \$1.00-\$2.00 funded by prior excess earnings. Because of rising fuel costs, on May 18, 2026, Interstate Navigation filed a Settlement Agreement executed with the Division of Public Utilities and Carriers that, if approved, would (1) add certain tax savings to the fuel reserve, and (2) eliminate the current fuel credit to more slowly reduce the balance in the fuel reserve and delay potential application of a new fuel surcharge. The result is that customers will pay the full tariffed rate for passenger and vehicle tickets. On May 22, 2026, Interstate caused a notice to be posted at the ticket offices in Galilee and on Block Island which advised that the Commission would accept comments through June 4, 2026. The Notice is also posted on Interstate’s website. Interstate had requested an effective date of June 1, 2026. However, because no Commission action has yet been taken, the credit remains applicable to the tickets sold until the effective date of any Commission decision. If approved, any tickets sold prior to the effective date of the Commission’s decision will include the credit and no adjustment will be made to reverse the credit on the date of travel. At this Open Meeting, the Commission will review the Settlement Agreement, and a vote will be taken.
- III. **Docket No. 24-51-WW – Providence Water Supply Board (Providence Water)** - This docket pertains to Providence Water Supply Board’s (Providence Water) request to implement step two of Providence Water’s multi-year rate plan that was approved by the PUC on July 24, 2025 (PUC Order No. 25493). The PUC conducted an evidentiary hearing on May 28, 2026. At this Open Meeting, the Commission will review the record, and a vote will be taken.
- IV. **Docket No. 26-09-EL - The Narragansett Electric Company d/b/a Rhode Island Energy (Company)** – This docket pertains to the Company’s tariff advice filing to amend the LTCRER Recovery Provision and LTCRER Reconciliation Provision. The proposed tariffs would go into effect on July 1, 2026, absent the Commission suspending the effective date. At this Open Meeting, the Commission will review the filings, and a vote may be taken to suspend the date on which the proposed tariffs would take effect.

V. **Consent Agenda** – All items listed within the Consent Agenda are to be considered routine by the Commission and will ordinarily be enacted by one motion. There will be no separate discussion of these items unless a member of the Commission requests, in which event the item will be removed for separate consideration later on the agenda. As noted below, the agenda includes applications for eligibility as a Renewable Energy Resource and PUC consultant’s recommendation on the applications.

RES-23-30	IGS USB VII, LLC	Application to add 108 customer sited Generation Units to its IGS Solar, LLC – 23RI-2T2QK for eligibility as New Renewable Energy Resources. The Generation Units are located in Rhode Island and have achieved operations and have a total combined capacity of 0.86942 MW AC (.99804 MW DC). PUC consultant recommends approval.
RES-26-11	Balise T, LLC	Application for eligibility of the Balise Toyota Solar, Generation Unit .36 MW AC (.4925 MW DC) solar energy facility located in Warwick, Rhode Island. PUC consultant recommends approval.
