City of Providence Announces Winter Rates for Providence Community Electricity Program

Wednesday, October 1, 2025

City's Default Electricity Option Winter Rate to Begin at 14.690 ¢/kWh This November

Today, the City of Providence announced the new winter supply rates for the Providence Community Electricity (PCE) program, starting with the November 2025 meter read. The program's winter pricing for the default electricity option is 10% less than last winter and will still offer cleaner electricity and cost savings compared to RI Energy's Last Resort Service. The new rates will be fixed for six months, through customers' May 2026 meter read. **Current participants do not need to take any action to remain in the program and receive the new pricing for the product in which they are currently enrolled.**

"As we confront the challenges of climate change, my Administration is committed to making Providence more sustainable and resilient for our neighbors," said Mayor Brett P. Smiley. "With the Providence Community Electricity Program, we are not only providing affordable, renewable energy, but also helping our neighbors better manage their electricity costs. This program plays a crucial role in our ongoing efforts to build a cleaner, greener Providence, ensuring that everyone benefits from lower energy costs and a reduced carbon footprint."

The City is pleased to have delivered on the program's goals of offering residents and businesses cleaner electricity, at affordable prices. The program's residential prices for the default product remains lower than RI Energy's Last Resort Service prices, while adding 5% additional renewable energy. The additional renewable energy is sourced entirely from local Rhode Island projects, including the Narragansett Bay Commission wind turbines at Fields Point in Providence, solar in West Greenwich and additional wind turbines in Coventry.

City of Providence Announces Summer Rates for Providence Community Electricity Program

Friday, April 3

City's Default Electricity Option Summer Residential Rate to Begin at 13.519 ¢/kWh this May

Today, the City of Providence announced the new summer supply rates for the Providence Community Electricity (PCE) program, starting with the May 2026 meter read. The prices of the program's electricity options will **decrease by 8%** and the program default option, Providence Standard, will continue to include **5% additional renewable energy** from local projects in Rhode Island. The new prices will be fixed for six months through customers' November 2026 meter read. **Current participants do not need to take any action to remain in the program and receive the new pricing for the product in which they are currently enrolled.**

This program has provided residential customers with cleaner electricity for the past 36 months, compared to Last Resort Service. Since the program's launch, the average resident who enrolled in the Providence Standard rate has saved approximately \$55 over the life of the program compared to those with RI Energy's Last Resort Service. In 2025, PCE had an annual purchase of 12,540 MWh of voluntary renewable energy, which is equivalent to avoiding emissions from 8.8 million Lbs. of CO2 or 4.4 million lbs. of coal burned. Amidst continuing volatility in the global fossil fuel industry, the program's commitment to expanding renewable energy in our region will support long term power security.

The program's additional renewable energy supports RI-based clean energy economy, being sourced entirely from in-state projects, including the Narragansett Bay Commission wind turbines at Fields Point in Providence, solar in West Greenwich and additional wind turbines in Coventry. Providence is part of a group of seven municipalities who shared in launching the first municipal aggregation programs in Rhode Island. Barrington, Central Falls, Narragansett, Newport, Portsmouth, Providence and South Kingstown are all working with Good Energy as their consultant and share a common electricity supplier and pricing.

Participants looking for the lowest cost in the program can switch to Providence Basic.

The City of Providence is pleased to introduce you to the Providence Community Electricity Program, our city's electricity supply program. The Program aims to help our community members manage electricity costs, increase renewable energy use, and reduce carbon pollution. Providence City Council approved this program in July 2020.

You received this letter because your electricity account is scheduled for automatic enrollment in Providence's program starting July 2025. The deadline to take action before enrollment is June 9, 2025. Your participation in Providence's program is voluntary and this letter explains your options.

YOUR OPTIONS

- 1 Automatically enroll in Providence Standard** - To enroll in Providence Standard, no action is needed.
- 2 Choose to enroll in another Providence product** - To choose another Providence product, call our program's electricity supplier, NextEra Energy Services Rhode Island, LLC, at (888) 387-1084, or submit a request at Electricity.ProvidenceRI.gov.
- 3 Choose to continue with Rhode Island Energy's supply, called Last Resort Service** - To remain with Last Resort Service for your electricity supply, you must opt out. To opt out before being automatically enrolled, you must take one of the following actions on or before **June 9, 2025**:

ELECTRICITY SUPPLY PRODUCT DETAIL

- Program prices apply to service beginning and ending on the days of the month that your meter is read.
- Program prices include a fee of \$0.001 per kilowatt-hour (kWh) for the City's aggregation consultant. Any applicable taxes will be added to your bill by Rhode Island Energy.
- At the end of the pricing term, you will be automatically renewed in your current product which may have a new price and a different percentage of voluntary renewable energy as negotiated by the City. Pricing is expected to change every six to twelve months for Residential customers. The City will announce price changes at least 30 days before any such price change takes effect. Product details will always be available at the city's website for the Program: Electricity.ProvidenceRI.gov.
- You may leave the Program at any time by contacting Providence's Supplier at (888) 387-1084 or by visiting the Program website at Electricity.ProvidenceRI.gov.
- Rhode Island requires all electricity supply products to include a minimum amount of renewable energy, known as the Renewable Energy Standard (RES). Some Providence Program products contain voluntary renewable energy that exceeds the RES, as shown below:

Generation sources that qualify for the RES are known as RI New and must be built after 1997 and be located within, or delivered to, New England (2% may come from sources built prior to 1997, called RI Existing). The Barrington Program sources all voluntary renewable energy, above the RES, from sources that qualify as RI New, come from solar, wind, anaerobic digestion, and low-impact hydro, and are located only within New England.

PROVIDENCE PROGRAM DETAIL

- There are two parts to your Rhode Island Energy electricity bill, (1) Delivery Services and (2) Supply Services. If you participate in Providence's program:
 - Rhode Island Energy will continue to provide all Delivery Services, including responding to power outages. You will continue to receive your electricity bill from Rhode Island Energy.
 - The Supply Services portion of the Rhode Island Energy bill will change to reflect your participation in Providence's program.
 - Customers in the Low-Income Rate Class (A60) will continue to receive their current percentage discount on the entire electricity bill.
 - Budget billing customers will continue to receive budget billing for the Delivery Services portion of the bill.
 - Customers that receive solar electricity benefits from net metering credits and/or Renewable Energy Growth Program payments will continue to receive those benefits.
 - You may leave the Program or switch to a different program option at any time, without penalty.
- If you have questions about the Delivery Services portion of your bill or about Last Resort Service supply, contact Rhode Island Energy at (855) 743-1101, or visit RIEnergy.com.
- If you are receiving electricity supply from a competitive supplier and believe you have received this opt-out letter in error, you must notify Providence's Supplier as outlined in the third option above. This will ensure you continue to receive your electricity from that competitive supplier and prevent any possible early termination fees.

- Al final del plazo de las tarifas vigentes, se le renovará automáticamente su producto actual, que podrá tener un nuevo precio y un porcentaje diferente de energía renovable voluntaria de acuerdo con lo negociado por la Ciudad. Se prevé que las tarifas cambien cada seis o doce meses para los clientes residenciales. La Ciudad anunciará los cambios de precios al menos 30 días antes de que entren en vigor. Las fuentes de generación que califican para el RES, que se conocen como RI Nuevas, deben estar construidas después de 1997 y ubicarse dentro de New England o ser entregadas a New England (el dos por ciento puede proceder de fuentes construidas antes de 1997, a las que se denomina RI Existentes). El Programa de Providence obtiene toda la energía renovable voluntaria, por encima del RES, de fuentes que califican como RI Nuevas, que provienen de energía solar, eólica, de digestión anaerobia e hidroeléctrica de bajo impacto y que se ubican únicamente dentro de New England.

- 1. What is Providence Community Electricity?** Providence Community Electricity (PCE) is our City's electricity supply program. It is designed to provide residents and businesses competitive rates and options in renewable energy. This program was approved by the City Council in July 2020. Six other RI communities are also participating in the program. Together, these towns and cities chose NextEra Energy Services Rhode Island as their electricity supplier. The program started in May 2023.
- 2. Why did I get this Notification Letter?** Customers using Rhode Island Energy's (RI Energy) default electricity supply are eligible for automatic enrollment in the City's program. The City sends these customers a letter detailing their upcoming automatic enrollment, program prices and options, and how to avoid being enrolled (called opting out).
- 3. Why is this an automatic enrollment program?** In July 2020, the Providence City Council permitted automatic enrollment to give the City enough buying power to negotiate favorable rates for the community.
- 4. What changes if someone participates in Providence Community Electricity?** There are two parts to a RI Energy electricity bill – (1) Supply Services and (2) Delivery Services. Enrolling in PCE only changes the Supply Services part. RI Energy will continue to provide all Delivery Services, which includes responding to power outages and billing services.
- 5. Will I get another bill?** No, there will still only be one electricity bill per month, sent by RI Energy.
- 6. Will this program cost more or less than RI Energy?** The goal of PCE is to provide a stable and cost competitive supply products compared to RI Energy's Last Resort Service. Savings compared to the utility rate cannot be guaranteed in every contract period going forward. That said, Good Energy, the City's consulting partner for this program, has secured savings for its approximately 50 active clients in Massachusetts over the course of each of those programs. Remember, if you are dissatisfied with PCE performance, you may always opt out at any time, without penalty, which will be effective at the next meter read.
- 7. What about Low-Income discounts or budget billing?** Customers in the Low-Income Rate Class (A60) will continue to receive their existing benefits. Budget Billing customers will continue to receive benefits on the delivery portion of the bill, however budget billing is not yet available on the supply portion of the bill.
- 8. What about solar and net metering?** Customers that receive solar electricity benefits from net metering credits, Community Shared Solar, and/or the Renewable Energy Growth program will continue to receive those benefits.
- 9. What are all of the program options?** Customers who do not proactively choose an option are enrolled in Providence Standard (34% renewable). PCE offers three other electricity options, detailed in the Notification Letter.
- 10. Can I opt-out or switch to a different program option?** Yes. Anyone may opt-out of the program or switch to a different program option at any time, without penalty. To do so:

- 1. What is Providence Community Electricity?** Providence Community Electricity (PCE) is our City's electricity supply program. It is designed to provide residents and businesses competitive rates and options in renewable energy. This program was approved by the City Council in July 2020. Six other RI communities are also participating in the program. Together, these towns and cities chose NextEra Energy Services Rhode Island as their electricity supplier. The program started in May 2023.
- 2. Why did I get this Notification Letter?** Customers using Rhode Island Energy's (RI Energy) default electricity supply are eligible for automatic enrollment in the City's program. The City sends these customers a letter detailing their upcoming automatic enrollment, program prices and options, and how to avoid being enrolled (called opting out).
- 3. Why is this an automatic enrollment program?** In July 2020, the Providence City Council permitted automatic enrollment to give the City enough buying power to negotiate favorable rates for the community.
- 4. What changes if someone participates in Providence Community Electricity?** There are two parts to a RI Energy electricity bill – (1) Supply Services and (2) Delivery Services. Enrolling in PCE only changes the Supply Services part. RI Energy will continue to provide all Delivery Services, which includes responding to power outages and billing services.
- 5. Will I get another bill?** No, there will still only be one electricity bill per month, sent by RI Energy.
- 6. Will this program cost more or less than RI Energy?** The goal of PCE is to provide a stable and cost competitive supply products compared to RI Energy's Last Resort Service. Savings compared to the utility rate cannot be guaranteed in every contract period going forward. That said, Good Energy, the City's consulting partner for this program, has secured savings for its approximately 50 active clients in Massachusetts over the course of each of those programs. Remember, if you are dissatisfied with PCE performance, you may always opt out at any time, without penalty, which will be effective at the next meter read.
- 7. What about Low-Income discounts or budget billing?** Customers in the Low-Income Rate Class (A60) will continue to receive their existing benefits. Budget Billing customers will continue to receive benefits on the delivery portion of the bill, however budget billing is not yet available on the supply portion of the bill.
- 8. What about solar and net metering?** Customers that receive solar electricity benefits from net metering credits, Community Shared Solar, and/or the Renewable Energy Growth program will continue to receive those benefits.
- 9. What are all of the program options?** Customers who do not proactively choose an option are enrolled in Providence Standard (34% renewable). PCE offers three other electricity options, detailed in the Notification Letter.
- 10. Can I opt-out or switch to a different program option?** Yes. Anyone may opt-out of the program or switch to a different program option at any time, without penalty. To do so:

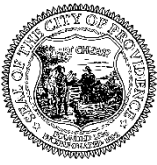

Frequently Asked Questions | Electricity.ProvidenceRI.gov

- 1. What is Providence Community Electricity?** Providence Community Electricity is our City's electricity supply program. It is designed to provide residents and businesses competitive rates and options in renewable energy. This program was approved by the City Council in July 2020. Seven other RI communities are also participating in the program. Together, these towns and cities chose NextEra Energy Services Rhode Island as their electricity supplier. The program started in May 2023.
- 2. Why did I get this Notification Letter?** Customers using Rhode Island Energy's (RI Energy) default electricity supply are eligible for automatic enrollment in the City's program. The City sends these customers a letter detailing their upcoming automatic enrollment, program prices and options, and how to avoid being enrolled (called opting out).
- 3. Why is this an automatic enrollment program?** In July 2020, the Providence City Council permitted automatic enrollment to give the City enough buying power to negotiate favorable rates for the community.
- 4. What changes if someone participates in Providence Community Electricity?** There are two parts to a RI Energy electricity bill – (1) Supply Services and (2) Delivery Services. Enrolling in the program only changes the Supply Services part. RI Energy will continue to provide all Delivery Services, which includes responding to power outages and billing services.
- 5. Will I get another bill?** No, there will still only be one electricity bill per month, sent by RI Energy.
- 6. Will this program cost more or less than RI Energy?** The goal of this program is to provide a stable and cost competitive supply products compared to RI Energy's Last Resort Service. Savings compared to the utility rate cannot be guaranteed in every contract period going forward. That said, Good Energy– the City's consulting partner for this program– has secured savings for its approximately 50 active clients in Massachusetts over the course of each of those programs. Remember, if you are dissatisfied with the program's performance, you may always opt out at any time, without penalty, which will be effective within 1-2 billing cycles.
- 7. What about Low-Income discounts or budget billing?** Customers in the Low-Income Rate Class (A60) will continue to receive their existing benefits. Budget Billing customers will continue to receive benefits on the delivery and supply portion of the bill. Customers enrolled in an Arrearage Management Plan ("AMP") Program must finish their AMP to participate in the program.
- 8. What about solar and net metering?** Customers that receive solar electricity benefits from net metering credits, Community Shared Solar, and/or the Renewable Energy Growth program will continue to receive those benefits.
- 9. What are all of the program options?** Customers who do not proactively choose an option are enrolled in Providence Standard (39% renewable). Providence Community Electricity offers three other electricity options, detailed in the Notification Letter.
- 10. Can I opt-out or switch to a different program option?** Yes. Anyone may opt-out of the program or switch to a different program option at any time, without penalty. To do so:

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- 11. What information do I need to share with NextEra Energy Services Rhode Island to opt-out, switch from standard to another option, or opt-in?** When contacting NextEra Energy Services Rhode Island or RI Energy to opt-out, change your product, or opt-in, you will need: (1) Account holder name, (2) Account service address, and (3) Account number.

- 1. ¿Qué es Electricidad Comunitaria de Providence y por qué estamos haciendo esto?** El Programa Comunitario de Electricidad de Providence, es el programa de suministro de electricidad de nuestra Ciudad diseñado para brindar a tarifas y opciones competitivas en energía renovable. Este programa fue aprobado por el Concejo Municipal de Providence en julio de 2020. Otras siete comunidades de Rhode Island actualmente participan en el mismo programa. Estas ciudades eligieron a NextEra Energy Services Rhode Island como su proveedor de electricidad. El programa comenzó en mayo de 2023.
- 2. ¿Por qué recibí esta carta de notificación?** Los clientes que utilizan el suministro de electricidad de Rhode Island Energy (RI Energy) son elegibles para la inscripción automática en el programa. Esta carta proporciona a dichos clientes esta carta que detalla la próxima inscripción automática, los precios del programa y cómo no inscribirse (lo que se denomina optar por no participar).
- 3. ¿Por qué es este un programa de inscripción automática?** En julio de 2020, el Concejo Municipal de Providence permitió la inscripción automática para darle a la Ciudad suficiente poder adquisitivo y así poder negociar tarifas favorables para la comunidad.
- 4. ¿Qué cambia si alguien participa en el programa?** Hay dos partes en la factura de electricidad de RI Energy: (1) Servicios de suministro y (2) Servicios de entrega. Al inscribirse en la Electricidad Comunitaria de Providence solo cambia la parte de Servicios de Suministro. RI Energy continuará brindando todos los Servicios de entrega, lo que incluye responder a cortes de energía.
- 5. ¿Recibiré otra factura?** No, solo habrá una factura de electricidad por mes, enviada por RI Energy.
- 6. ¿Este programa costará más o menos que lo que pago en estos momentos?** El objetivo de este programa es proporcionar productos de suministro estables y con costos competitivos en comparación con el Servicio de Último Recurso de RI Energy. No se pueden garantizar ahorros en comparación con la tarifa de servicios públicos en cada período del contrato en el futuro. Dicho esto, Good Energy, el socio consultor de la ciudad para este programa, ha asegurado ahorros para sus aproximadamente 50 clientes activos en Massachusetts en el transcurso de cada uno de esos programas. Recuerde, si no está satisfecho con el desempeño del programa, siempre podrá darse de baja en cualquier momento, sin penalización, con efecto dentro de 1-2 ciclos de facturación.
- 7. ¿Qué pasa con los descuentos por bajos ingresos o la facturación del presupuesto?** Los clientes de la clase de tarifa de bajos ingresos (A60) seguirán recibiendo sus beneficios actuales. Los clientes de Facturación Presupuestada seguirán recibiendo beneficios en la parte de entrega y suministro de la factura.
- 8. ¿Qué pasa con la medición solar y neta?** Los clientes que reciben beneficios de electricidad solar de créditos de medición neta, energía solar comunitaria, y/o pagos del programa de Crecimiento de Energía Renovable continuarán recibiendo esos beneficios.
- 9. ¿Cuáles son las opciones del programa?** Los clientes que no eligen una opción de forma proactiva se inscriben en Providence Standard (39% renovable). El programa ofrece otras tres opciones de electricidad (vea la carta de notificación).
- 10. ¿Puedo no participar o cambiar a otra opción?** Si. Se puede optar por no participar o por cambiar su opción del programa en cualquier momento, sin penalización. Para hacer, realice cualquiera de las siguientes acciones:
