I am writing to express my concerns and strong opposition of the proposed expansion, and permanent installation of the LNG storage facility on Old Mill Lane. This was originally sold as a temporary solution to emergency LNG storage. We all know that it has become much more than “small” or “temporary” and our community is not going to stand for this action. Our voices must be heard and our opposition must be recognized.

Old Mill Lane is not a place for such a dangerous facility. National Grid should not have the power to dictate or drive this decision. This is a community decision and from all community discussions thus far, the community rejects the entire idea of the expansion of this site. Safety is always top priority, clearly this is NOT a location to position such a volatile gas facility. We have voiced our concerns as a community and it appears that our legitimate safety and logistical concerns have been dismissed. You state that that National Grid continues to investigate/assess the issues presented by the town but we know that these are just words and all they are trying to do is buy time. National Grid simply wants that least costly facility with a blatant disregard to the Property Tax Payers surround this site.

It is time for this facility to Go away permanently. Please hear our voices and concerns.
