FUEL SOURCE PLAN FOR ELIGIBLE BIOMASS

The Rhode Island Renewable Energy Standard Section 3.6 qualifies landfill gas, as an "eligible biomass fuel." The _Model City_ facility (the Facility") will be using landfill gas as the fuel source for the electricity generated by the Facility. The landfill gas used at the Facility is the result of "the natural decomposition of waste, and that would otherwise be vented or flared as part of the landfill's normal operation if not used as a fuel source."

To assure that only the eligible landfill gas is used at the Facility, the Facilities generators are monitored twenty four a day by PLC controls and SCADA systems. The Gas is continuously monitored by a gas analyzer and can be viewed by the SCADA system. In additions operators do

daily inspections of the generators, as well as take daily samples of the gas with a gas meter to ensure the gas is eligible quality landfill gas.

As for collection and bring only eligible landfill gas to the generators, the Facility is located at the site of the source landfill. The source landfill has a series of gas wells and horizontal collectors that go to a main gas header. The header connects to the Facility were blowers draw the landfill gas to the Facility. No common carrier pipes are used.

The Facility is not "co-fired" with ineligible fuels, only with eligible landfill gas. In addition, only eligible landfill gas is brought to the Facility's generator.

Dear Mr. Cowell,

On behalf of the Division of Energy Resources (the Division), I am pleased to inform you that your Application for Statement of Qualification pursuant to the Massachusetts Renewable Energy Portfolio Standard (RPS) Regulations, 225 CMR 14.00, is hereby approved. The Division finds that the Generation Unit meets the requirements for eligibility as a New Renewable Generation Unit pursuant to 225 CMR 14.05.

Each Massachusetts New Renewable Generation Unit is assigned a unique Massachusetts RPS Identification Number (MA RPS ID#). The MA RPS ID # stated on the Statement of Qualification must be included in all correspondence with the Division. Model City Energy Facility's MA RPS ID# is: LG-1027-04.

However, the Unit's Statement of Qualification is conditioned by the following special provisions of 225 CMR 14.05(5) that pertain to any Generation Unit that is located outside of the ISO-New England control area:

The portion of the total electrical energy output that qualifies as New Renewable Generation in a given time period shall meet requirements that include, but are not limited to, the following:

- (a) An External Unit Contract shall be executed between the Generation Unit Owner or Operator and an electrical energy purchaser located in the ISO-NE Control Area for delivery of the Unit's electrical energy to the ISO-NE Control Area. The External Unit Contract shall include associated transmission rights for delivery of the Unit's electrical energy over the ties from an adjacent control area to the ISO-NE Control Area; and
- (b) The Generation Unit Owner or Operator shall provide documentation, satisfactory to the Division, that:
 - 1. the electrical energy delivered pursuant to the External Unit Contract was settled in the ISO-NE Market Settlement System;
 - 2. the Generation Unit produced, during the applicable month, the amount of MWhs claimed, as verified by the NE-GIS administrator;
 - 3. the electrical energy delivered under the External Unit Contract received a North American Electricity Reliability Council Tag confirming transmission from the originating Control Area to the ISO-NE Control Area; and
 - 4. the New Renewable Generation Attributes have not otherwise been, nor will be, sold, retired, claimed or represented as part of electrical energy output or sales, or used to satisfy obligations in jurisdictions other than Massachusetts.

The Division wishes to remind you of the notification requirements for changes in eligibility status contained in 225 CMR 14.06(3). The Owner or Operator of the Generation Unit shall submit notification of such changes to the Division no later than five days following the end of the month during which such changes were implemented.

The Division also wishes to remind you to be cognizant of the Operating Rules and the reporting requirements of the NEPOOL GIS, which may be amended from time to time, and compliance with which may affect the RPS qualification of your Generation Unit's GIS certificates.

The Model City Energy/LFG to Energy Facility is located adjacent to the Modern Landfill at Pletcher and Harold Roads in Model City, New York. This is a Landfill Gas to Energy (LFGTE) Facility which combusts scrubbed landfill gas to produce electrical power for sale on the open market. There are currently seven (7) Caterpillar G3516 (16-cylinder) internal combustion engines fueled by scrubbed landfill gas obtained from Modern Landfill driving seven (7) generator sets that produce approximately 5.6 Mw of electricity.

This is a modification of the existing 6 NYCRR Part 201-6 Title V permit which will allow the facility to install four (4) instead of three (3) new 460-cubic feet per minute (cfm) Caterpillar G3520 (20cylinder) gas generator set engines to increase combustion and electrical generation capacity. An emissions inventory was conducted of the Landfill Gas to Energy (LFGTE) Facility, along with incorporating the emissions of Modern Landfill, to evaluate past actual, future potential and future actual total emissions. These calculations confirmed that the facility is not a major source and that the



project will remain below a 250 ton per year net increase of carbon monoxide emissions and 100 ton per year net increase of oxides of nitrogen. These emissions thresholds, therefore, do not trigger applicability of Prevention of Significant Deterioration (PSD under 40 CFR 52) nor New Source Review (NSR under 6 NYCRR 231-2). The facility will now potentially be a major source for Oxides of Nitrogen and Carbon Monoxide.

By acceptance of this permit, the permittee agrees that the permit is contingent upon strict compliance with the ECL, all applicable regulations, the General Conditions specified and any Special Conditions included as part of this permit.

- (3) During the period of the emergency the facility owner and/or operator took all reasonable steps to minimize levels of emissions that exceeded the emission standards, or other requirements in the permit; and
- (4) The facility owner and/or operator notified the Department within two working days after the event occurred. This notice must contain a description of the emergency, any steps taken to mitigate emissions, and corrective actions taken.
- (b) In any enforcement proceeding, the facility owner and/or operator seeking to establish the occurrence of an emergency has the burden of proof.
- (c) This provision is in addition to any emergency or upset provision contained in any applicable requirement.

Item B:

Public Access to Recordkeeping for Title V Facilities - 6NYCRR Part 201-1.10(b)

The Department will make available to the public any permit application, compliance plan, permit, and monitoring and compliance certification report pursuant to Section 503(e) of the Act, except for information entitled to confidential treatment pursuant to 6NYCRR Part 616 - Public Access to records and Section 114(c) of the Act.

Item C:

Timely Application for the Renewal of Title V Permits - 6 NYCRR Part

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201-6.3(a)(4)

Owners and/or operators of facilities having an issued Title V permit shall submit a complete application at least 180 days, but not more than eighteen months, prior to the date of permit expiration for permit renewal purposes.

All permittees granted a Title V facility permit shall be covered under the protection of a permit shield, except as provided under 6 NYCRR Subpart 201-6. Compliance with the conditions of the permit shall be deemed compliance with any applicable requirements as of the date of permit issuance, provided that such applicable requirements are included and are specifically identified in the permit, or the Department, in acting on the permit application or revision, determines in writing that other requirements specifically identified are not applicable to the major stationary source, and the permit includes the determination or a concise summary thereof. Nothing herein shall preclude the Department from revising or revoking the permit pursuant to 6 NYCRR Part 621 or from exercising its summary abatement authority. Nothing in this permit shall alter or affect the following:

- i. The ability of the Department to seek to bring suit on behalf of the State of New York, or the Administrator to seek to bring suit on behalf of the United States, to immediately restrain any person causing or contributing to pollution presenting an imminent and substantial endangerment to public health, welfare or the environment to stop the emission of air pollutants causing or contributing to such pollution;
- ii. The liability of a permittee of the Title V facility for any violation of applicable requirements prior to or at the time of permit issuance;
- iii. The applicable requirements of Title IV of the Act;
- iv. The ability of the Department or the Administrator to obtain information from the permittee concerning the ability to enter, inspect and monitor the facility.

Item K: Reopening for Cause - 6 NYCRR Part 201-6.5(i)

This Title V permit shall be reopened and revised under any of the following circumstances:

i. If additional applicable requirements under the Act become applicable where this permit's remaining term is three or more years, a reopening shall be completed not later than 18 months after promulgation of the applicable requirement. No such reopening is

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required if the effective date of the requirement is later than the date on which this permit is due to expire, unless the original permit or any of its terms and conditions has been extended by the Department pursuant to the provisions of Part 201-6.7 and Part 621.

- ii. The Department or the Administrator determines that the permit contains a material mistake or that inaccurate statements were made in establishing the emissions standards or other terms or conditions of the permit.
- iii. The Department or the Administrator determines that the Title V permit must be revised or reopened to assure compliance with applicable requirements.
- iv. If the permitted facility is an "affected source" subject to the requirements of Title IV of the Act, and additional requirements (including excess emissions requirements) become applicable. Upon approval by the Administrator, excess emissions offset plans shall be deemed to be incorporated into the permit.

Proceedings to reopen and issue Title V facility permits shall follow the same procedures as apply to initial permit issuance but shall affect only those parts of the permit for which cause to reopen exists.

Reopenings shall not be initiated before a notice of such intent is provided to the facility by the Department at least thirty days in advance of the date that the permit is to be reopened, except that the Department may provide a shorter time period in the case of an emergency.

Item L: Permit Exclusion - ECL 19-0305

The issuance of this permit by the Department and the receipt thereof by the Applicant does not and shall not be construed as barring, diminishing, adjudicating or in any way affecting any legal, administrative or equitable rights or claims, actions, suits, causes of action or demands whatsoever that the Department may have against the Applicant for violations based on facts and circumstances alleged to have occurred or existed prior to the effective date of this permit, including, but not limited to, any enforcement action authorized pursuant to the provisions of applicable federal law, the Environmental Conservation Law of the State of New York (ECL) and Chapter III of the Official Compilation of the Codes, Rules and Regulations of the State of New York (NYCRR). The issuance of this permit also shall not in any way affect pending or future enforcement actions under the Clean Air Act brought by the United States or any person.



Item M:

Federally Enforceable Requirements - 40 CFR 70.6(b)

All terms and conditions in this permit required by the Act or any applicable requirement, including any provisions designed to limit a facility's potential to emit, are enforceable by the Administrator and citizens under the Act. Notify the Department and report permit deviations and incidences of noncompliance stating the probable cause of such deviations, and any corrective actions or preventive measures taken. Where the underlying applicable requirement contains a definition of prompt or otherwise specifies a time frame for reporting deviations, that definition or time frame shall govern. Where the underlying applicable requirement fails to address the time frame for reporting deviations, reports of deviations shall be submitted to the permitting authority based on the following schedule:

- (1) For emissions of a hazardous air pollutant (as identified in an applicable regulation) that continue for more than an hour in excess of permit requirements, the report must be made within 24 hours of the occurrence.
- (2) For emissions of any regulated air pollutant, excluding those listed in paragraph (1) of this section, that continue for more than two hours in excess of permit requirements, the report must be made within 48 hours.
- (3) For all other deviations from permit requirements, the report shall be contained in the 6 month monitoring report required above.
- (4) This permit may contain a more stringent reporting requirement than required by paragraphs (1), (2) or (3) above. If more stringent reporting requirements have been placed in this permit or exist in applicable requirements that apply to this facility, the more stringent reporting requirement shall apply.

If above paragraphs (1) or (2) are met, the source must notify the permitting authority by telephone during normal business hours at the Regional Office of jurisdiction for this permit, attention Regional Air Pollution Control Engineer (RAPCE) according to the timetable listed in paragraphs (1) and (2) of this section. For deviations and incidences that must be reported outside of normal business hours, on weekends, or holidays, the DEC Spill Hotline phone number at 1-800-457-7362 shall be used. A written notice, certified by a responsible official consistent with 6 NYCRR Part 201-6.3(d)(12), must be submitted within 10 working days of an occurrence for deviations reported under (1) and (2). All deviations reported under paragraphs (1) and (2) of this section must also be identified in the 6 month monitoring report required above.



The provisions of 6 NYCRR 201-1.4 shall apply if the permittee seeks to have a violation excused unless otherwise limited by regulation. In order to have a violation of a federal regulation (such as a new source performance standard or national emissions standard for hazardous air pollutants) excused, the specific federal regulation must provide for an affirmative defense during start-up, shutdowns, malfunctions or upsets. Notwithstanding any recordkeeping and reporting requirements in 6 NYCRR 201-1.4, reports of any deviations shall not be on a less frequent basis than the reporting periods described in paragraphs (1) and (4) above.

In the case of any condition contained in this permit with a reporting requirement of "Upon request by regulatory agency" the permittee shall include in the semiannual report, a statement for each such condition that the monitoring or recordkeeping was performed as required or requested and a listing of all instances of deviations from these requirements.

In the case of any emission testing performed during the previous six month reporting period, either due to a request by the Department, EPA, or a regulatory requirement, the permittee shall include in the semiannual report a summary of the testing results and shall indicate whether or not the Department or EPA has approved the results.

All semiannual reports shall be submitted to the Administrator (or his or her representative) as well as two copies to the Department (one copy to the regional air pollution control engineer (RAPCE) in the regional office and one copy to the Bureau of Quality Assurance (BQA) in the DEC central office). Mailing addresses for the above referenced persons are contained in the monitoring condition for 6 NYCRR Part 201-6.5(e), contained elsewhere in this permit.



Any person who owns and/or operates stationary sources shall operate and maintain all emission units and any required emission control devices in compliance with all applicable Parts of this Chapter and existing laws, and shall operate the facility in accordance with all criteria, emission limits, terms, conditions, and standards in this permit. Failure of such person to properly operate and maintain the effectiveness of such emission units and emission control devices may be sufficient reason for the Department to revoke or deny a permit.

The owner or operator of the permitted facility must maintain all required records on-site for a period of five years and make them available to representatives of the Department upon request. Department representatives must be granted access to any facility regulated by this Subpart, during normal operating hours, for the purpose of determining compliance with this and any other state and federal air pollution control requirements, regulations or law.

At the discretion of the commissioner a violation of any applicable emission standard for necessary scheduled equipment maintenance, start-up/shutdown conditions and malfunctions or upsets may be excused if such violations are unavoidable. The following actions and recordkeeping and reporting requirements must be adhered to in such circumstances.

- (a) The facility owner and/or operator shall compile and maintain records of all equipment maintenance or start-up/shutdown activities when they can be expected to result in an exceedance of any applicable emission standard, and shall submit a report of such activities to the commissioner's representative when requested to do so in writing or when so required by a condition of a permit issued for the corresponding air contamination source except where conditions elsewhere in this permit which contain more stringent reporting and notification provisions for an applicable requirement, in which case they supercede those stated here. Such reports shall describe why the violation was unavoidable and shall include the time, frequency and duration of the maintenance and/or start-up/shutdown activities and the identification of air contaminants, and the estimated emission rates. If a facility owner and/or operator is subject to continuous stack monitoring and quarterly reporting requirements, he need not submit reports for equipment maintenance or start-up/shutdown for the facility to the commissioner's representative.
- (b) In the event that emissions of air contaminants in excess of any emission standard in 6 NYCRR Chapter III Subchapter A occur due to a malfunction, the facility owner and/or operator shall report such malfunction by telephone to the commissioner's representative as soon as possible during normal working hours, but in any event not later than two working days after becoming aware that the malfunction occurred. Within 30 days thereafter, when requested in writing by the commissioner's representative, the facility owner and/or operator shall submit a written report to the commissioner's representative describing the malfunction, the corrective action taken, identification of air contaminants, and an estimate of the emission rates. These reporting requirements are superceded by conditions elsewhere in this permit which contain reporting and notification provisions for applicable requirements more stringent than those above.
- (c) The Department may also require the owner and/or operator to include in reports described under (a) and (b) above an estimate of the maximum ground level concentration of each air contaminant emitted and the effect of such emissions depending on the deviation of the malfunction and the air contaminants emitted.
- (d) In the event of maintenance, start-up/shutdown or malfunction conditions which result in



emissions exceeding any applicable emission standard, the facility owner and/or operator shall take appropriate action to prevent emissions which will result in contravention of any applicable ambient air quality standard. Reasonably available control technology, as determined by the commissioner, shall be applied during any maintenance, start-up/shutdown or malfunction condition subject to this paragraph.

(e) In order to have a violation of a federal regulation (such as a new source performance standard or national emissions standard for hazardous air pollutants) excused, the specific federal regulation must provide for an affirmative defense during start-up, shutdowns, malfunctions or upsets.

Condition 43: Air pollution prohibited
