Woonsocket believes that the drop is a result of more than just seasonal changes due to weather. A large portion is most likely due to the economy coupled with housing foreclosures. These housing foreclosures are evidenced by the drop in 5/8 inch residential meters as illustrated on the attachment to the response to DIV2-4.

The large drop from fiscal years 2008 to 2009 was not isolated Woonsocket. The Commission opened a Docket (#4113) to address declining consumption reported by all of the regulated water suppliers along with the Narragansett Bay Commission.

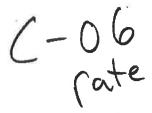
