Relating to Interconnection**


Dear Ms. Massaro:

Petitioners ACP Land, LLC and Wind Energy Development, LLC have read National Grid's filing of May 25, 2015. The Petitioners procedural concern is that while National Grid was asked to amend its interconnection tariff in this docket due to specific concerns arising out of this dispute resolution proceeding, this docket is not the place for National Grid to continue making unrelated revisions to its interconnection tariff. The parties to this docket do not represent all of the interests impacted by the proposed revisions and other potential stakeholders are entitled to notice and the opportunity to intervene and/or comment.

On the substance, to be clear, Petitioners informed National Grid that they have no objection to the proposed modifications upon National Grid's representation that these changes still will not require customers to definitively determine which program they will enroll in (renewable energy growth, net metering or other) or, which customer accounts will receive net metering credits at the time of the interconnection application. Although the Company prefers to receive such information as early as possible, there is no reason to require any such commitments before initiating interconnection.

During this dialogue, Petitioners also asked National Grid for an update regarding the anticipated guidance from the Internal Revenue Service on the interconnection tax issue that is pending in this docket. National Grid's response was that no additional information is available at this time.
