MOTION OF INTERSTATE NAVIGATION COMPANY SEEKING EXPEDITED APPROVAL OF REVISED FAST FERRY RATES AND WAIVERS

Interstate Navigation Company (Interstate) operates a seasonal discretionary fast ferry passenger service between Point Judith and Block Island.

Fast Ferry rates have not changed since 2016. Interstate wishes to revise its Point Judith to Block Island fast ferry rates, and Interstate respectfully requests expedited approval of this rate filing so that the rates will be effective in thirty (30) days, due to the coronavirus pandemic.

The proposed revised rates would increase the Point Judith to Block Island adult fast adult ferry rates to \$25 one-way (\$50 round-trip). Child fast ferry rates would increase to \$15 one-way (\$30 round-trip). The frequent user booklets and the volume discounts will be discontinued. All other fast ferry rates will remain unchanged.

Interstate is also asking, pursuant to R.I.G.L. § 39-3-12, that the Commission approve the revised fast ferry rates and tariffs and:

"... allow changes within less time than required by the notice specified in § 39-3-11, and without holding the hearing and investigation therein provided for, or modify the requirements of § 39-3-11 with respect to filing and publishing tariffs either in the particular instance or by general order applicable to special or particular circumstances or conditions ..."

Pursuant to this statutory authority, Interstate seeks a waiver of the hearing and investigation requirements of R.I.G.L. § 39-3-11 and § 39-3-12 relative to the rates for its fast ferry service. Interstate also requests that it be granted an exemption/waiver from the rate filing requirements of Part 5 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure.

In Order No. 22415 in Docket No. 4598 dated May 20, 2016, the Commission approved Interstate's last fast ferry rate increase and ruled:

"The Commission further found that a comprehensive rate proceeding was not required in this matter and therefore exercises its option under R.I. Gen. Laws § 39-3-12, finding good cause to exist to waive further investigation, further notice and public hearing, based upon the fact that the services, proposed by the applicant, do not constitute "lifeline" ferry services to an isolated ratepayer population. (at 2).

Interstate's fast ferry does not, nor is it required to, provide lifeline service. Interstate's fast ferry service is purely discretionary. It offers only passenger and bicycle service. It does not transport passenger cars. It is a matter of choice for consumers to utilize the fast ferry during the summer season to visit Block Island.

In contrast, Interstate also provides year-round, lifeline service. That service is necessary for residents of the Town of New Shoreham. It operates under separate tariffs applicable to the ferries that also transport vehicles and freight. The rates and charges for the lifeline service are not at issue in this case.

Finally, the profits from the fast ferry provide a benefit to the traditional, i.e., lifeline, service. Therefore, the lifeline service will not suffer from any competition resulting from the fast ferry alternative.

These new rates will apply only to Interstate's seasonal fast ferry passenger service (which is a purely discretionary service) between Point Judith and Block Island. They will not apply to Interstate's traditional lifeline ferry service or to Interstate's fast ferry service between Newport and Block Island.

In Docket No. 3495, this Commission likened fast ferry summer service to Block Island to a competitive local exchange carrier ("CLEC") because consumers have the discretion to choose the service.

This Commission has determined that fast ferry service is not a lifeline service and that the service is purely discretionary. This Commission has ruled that Interstate's fast ferry service should have the flexibility to set its own rates as long as the rates are not anti-competitive.

In a Memorandum dated March 4, 2016 in Docket 4598, the Division explained its recommended approval of the last fast ferry increase as follows:

In Docket 3762, which was Interstate Navigation's 2006 general rate filing, the Division and the Company reached a settlement on all issues in the case including the fast ferry rates and terms and conditions. Section III.E. of the settlement stated:

The Fast Ferry service is a purely discretionary service. Therefore, Interstate shall be authorized to apply to the Commission from time to time to change Fast Ferry Rates and Terms and Conditions and, with Commission approval, to implement such changes on thirty (30) days' notice. The Division, except in extraordinary circumstances, will not object to any such changes, and will not request compliance with any traditional rate filing requirements other than the thirty (30) day notice.

In its Decision in this docket, the Commission approved the settlement reached between Interstate and the Division.

As stated in the settlement, the Division agreed not to object to any change to the Fast Ferry Rates except in extraordinary circumstances. Currently there are no extraordinary circumstances that we are aware of that would cause the Division to object to Interstate's filing in this docket. As such, the Division has no objection to Interstate's proposed new rates and recommends the Commission approve the revised rates as filed.

Interstate is not requesting a waiver of notice of this filing (in a form to be approved by the Commission) to be published in its service territory within 10 days after the rate filing. A proposed notice has been sent for review and approval to the Commission Clerk. Upon approval, the notice will be published in the *Block Island Times* and the *Providence Journal* and posted at Interstate's ticket booths in both Point Judith and Block Island.

The existing fast ferry rates are attached to the Application. The proposed new fast ferry rates are also attached to the Application.

Accordingly, Interstate respectfully requests that the proposed revised fast ferry rates be approved by the Commission as filed, to become effective in thirty (30) days, without suspension.

NOTICE OF FILING

The Interstate Navigation Company ("Interstate") hereby gives notice that on May 27, 2020, Interstate filed with the Rhode Island Public Utilities Commission (the "Commission") proposed revised rates for its high-speed ferry service between Point Judith and Block Island. (Docket No. _____). These rates will apply only to Interstate's seasonal discretionary high-speed ferry passenger service between Point Judith and Block Island, and will not apply to its year-round conventional passenger and freight ferry service or to Interstate's high speed ferry service between Newport and Block Island. The proposed revised rates, if approved, would increase high-speed ferry ticket prices to \$25 one-way (\$50 round trip) for adults and \$15 one-way (\$30 round-trip). The frequent user booklets and the volume discounts will be discontinued. All other existing fast ferry rates will remain unchanged.

The Commission can suspend the proposed rates if it chooses to do so. However, Interstate is asking that these new rates be allowed to go into effect in thirty (30) days, without suspension or hearing.

All baggage must be enclosed in receptacles such as trunks, valises, suit cases, leather hat boxes or satchels provided with handles, securely locked or otherwise fastened and made of material of sufficient strength and durability and quality to withstand the rapid handling and piling incidental to its transportation.
- 4. No items considered to be freight may be transported on the fast ferry.

RULE NO. 15 BAGGAGE ACCOMPANYING PASSENGERS:

Each passenger purchasing an adult or child one way ticket will be allowed to transport without charge fifty (50) pounds of luggage or baggage, which must be carried on and off the ship by the passenger at points of embarkation and debarkation.

RULE NO. 20 ARTICLES IN AUTOMOBILES:

This rule is not applicable for the fast ferry at this time.

RULE NO. 25 DAMAGE TO AUTOMOBILES IN TRANSIT:

This rule is not applicable for the fast ferry at this time.

RULE NO. 30 ROUND TRIP TICKET:

The carrier will not be responsible to persons holding round trip tickets for failure to provide return carriage due to weather or mechanical failure; the carrier will honor the return ticket by providing carriage as soon as the weather and the sea are fit for navigation and the equipment is fit to operate.

RULE NO. 35 OVERSIZED VEHICLES:

This rule is not applicable for the fast ferry at this time.

RULE NO. 40 TIME LIMIT ON SUITS:

Suits to recover on any claim for loss of life or bodily injury must be instituted within one (1) year from the day when the death or injury occurred. Suits to recover on any claim other than loss of life or bodily injury, including breach of contract, must be instituted within six (6) months of the scheduled arrival of the passenger or property at destination.

RULE NO. 45 SCREENING AND INSPECTION:

Pursuant to Homeland Security Coast Guard Regulations, entering the ferry facility is deemed valid consent to screening or inspection; and failure to consent or submit to screening or inspection will result in denial or revocation of authorization to enter.

RULE NO. 50 ARTICLES LEFT ABOARD VESSEL:

Carrier will not be responsible for articles left aboard the vessel. Such shipments shall be charged for at the minimum rates provided in the company's tariffs.

RULE NO. 55 DAMAGE TO AUTOMOBILES:

This rule is not applicable for the fast ferry at this time.

RULE NO. 60 CAR RESERVATION CANCELLATIONS:

This rule is not applicable for the fast ferry at this time.

RULE NO. 65 VEHICLE OVERHANG CHARGE:

This rule is not applicable for the fast ferry at this time.

RULE NO. 70 NON-STANDARD VEHICLE CHARGES:

This rule is not applicable for the fast ferry at this time.

RULE NO. 75 BLOCK TICKET SALES CHARGE:

There is a \$15.00 block ticket sales service charge for all block sales of 25 or more tickets (e.g., weddings, corporate outings and other such events).

RULE NO. 80 ONLINE SALES CHARGE:

For all online internet ticket sales, there is a \$2.00 convenience fee per transaction.

There is a \$10.00 charge for all lost tickets which are replaced (each way).

- 1 Q. Will you please provide your full name and your employer for the record?
- 2 A. Yes, my name is David G. Bebyn, CPA. I am the President of B&E Consulting, LLC.
- 3 (B&E).

- 5 Q. Are you the same David G. Bebyn who has previously filed expert accounting and
- 6 rate testimony for Interstate Navigation Company (Interstate) in previous DPUC
- 7 and PUC dockets?
- 8 A. Yes, I am.

- 10 Q. Mr. Bebyn, have you testified as an expert accounting and rate witness prior to this
- 11 docket for other utilities?
- 12 A. Yes. I have provided expert testimony on rate related matters before utility commissions
- in Rhode Island and Connecticut. Regarding the Rhode Island Public Utilities
- 14 Commission, I have filed testimony and testified in the Woonsocket Water Department's
- 15 (WWD) Dockets No. 3800, No. 4320 and 4879 and Interstate's general rate filing Docket
- No. 4373 in support of the adjusted test year and rate design. I have also filed testimony
- on behalf of the Pascoag Utility District in Docket No. 4341, A & R Marine Corp. in
- Docket No. 4586, and Kent County Water Authority in Docket 4994. In addition, I filed
- testimony in support of Interstate's last fast ferry rate increase in Docket No. 4598.

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- 21 Q. Mr. Bebyn, what is the purpose of your testimony in this docket?
- 22 A. Interstate hired B&E to prepare testimony in support of its request for rate relief for its
- Point Judith to Block Island Fast Ferry operation. My testimony will provide the

information necessary for the DPUC and the PUC to adequately review the filing and for the PUC to hopefully approve the filing as filed.

4 Q. What is the subject of this filing?

Interstate is requesting approval from the PUC to change its Fast Ferry rates between
Point Judith and Block Island. These rates have not changed since 2016. In this
testimony, I will provide the reasoning for the proposed rate change.

Interstate's Fast Ferry operation has been described by the PUC as follows: "customers have the discretion to choose the service," the fast ferry service "does not provide lifeline service" and the service is "purely discretionary" (page 3 of PUC Order in Docket No. 3599). Based on this description, Interstate believes that new Fast Ferry rates can be approved by the PUC subject to a far lesser review by the DPUC and the PUC and the new Fast Ferry rates can be implemented without holding hearings.

Q. What Fast Ferry rate changes are being requested in this filing?

17 A. Interstate is asking to increase the Fast Ferry ticket rates as follows:

In addition, Interstate is asking to discontinue the frequent user booklets and volume discounts.

- 1 Q. Are there other proposed rate changes?
- 2 A. No.

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- 4 Q. Why is Interstate proposing these changes at this time?
- Due to the coronavirus pandemic, Interstate will be running the fast ferry at reduced passenger capacity. In order for the fast ferry operation to remain economically viable with such reduced passenger capacity, it is necessary for the rates to increase to cover Interstate's expenses such as crew, fuel, insurance, maintenance, repairs, etc. Hopefully, with these increased rates, the fast ferry operation will still be able to make a profit and

the profit will continue to be used to subsidize the traditional lifeline rates.
